



Kindergarten Attendance Leads to School Success

Kindergarten is an exciting and important year for you and your child - one of the most important years of school! Having great attendance in kindergarten will prepare your child to do well in school. As a parent, you are the best person to help your child understand why Attendance Counts - Every Day - Everyone!

DID YOU KNOW?

- ✓ When you enroll your child in kindergarten, Texas law requires he/she attends.
- ✓ Starting in kindergarten, too many absences can cause children to fall behind in learning.
- If your child misses just a day or two days every few weeks throughout the school year, these missed days add up to nearly a month of lost learning.
- ✓ Being late to school causes your child to miss out on important learning.

WHAT CAN YOU DO?

- 1. **Set a regular bedtime and morning routine.** Children are most able and willing to learn when they have had plenty of sleep.
- 2. **Set your alarm clocks** to make sure everyone gets up on time. **Allow time for the unexpected.** Consider having clothes and school bags ready the night before.
- 3. Have a back-up plan for getting your child to and from school if something comes up. Call on a family member, a neighbor, or another parent.
- 4. **Call the school Attendance Office** and let them know if your child will miss school or if you are having a hard time getting your child to school.
- 5. Make sure your child goes to school every day **unless they are sick.** If you're not sure if your child's sickness should result in an absence, call your child's doctor or the school nurse.
- Schedule your child's medical and dental appointments at the end of the school day. Plan your vacations outside of school time.
